



REGULATIONS for FAST and ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday, Feb. 18, and Good Friday, Apr. 3, and Fridays are days of fast and abstinence. Fasting is to be observed by all 18-59 years of age. On a fast day, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be eaten, but together should not equal a full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices are allowed. Abstinence is to be observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of
