

Father Robert A. Lange, who retired from active service in the Arlington Diocese in 2012, died May 4 at St. Joseph's Home for the Elderly in Richmond after a long illness. He was 70.

Father Lange was born June 13, 1944, in Richmond to Joseph and Thelma Lange. He attended St. Paul School and graduated from Benedictine High School, both in Richmond. After receiving a bachelor's degree from Belmont Abbey College in Belmont, N.C., in 1967, he spent 15 years working in the real estate business.

After discerning a priestly vocation, he attended Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, Md., and was ordained by Arlington Bishop John R. Keating May 10, 1986.

Father Lange served as parochial vicar of Queen of Apostles Church in Alexandria, 1986-90; Church of the Nativity in Burke, 1990-91; St. William of York Church in Stafford, 1991-94; and Our Lady of Lourdes Church, 1994-97. He was rector of St. Peter Mission in Washington, Va, from 1997-99, and pastor of Our Lady of Angels Church in Woodbridge from 1999-2005. Father Lange was appointed pastor of Holy Spirit Parish in Annandale in 2005 and served until his retirement Jan. 22, 2007, at which time he relocated to Shenandoah County. In 2011, he returned to full-time service as a parochial vicar for Our Lady of Lourdes Parish for one year.

Following retirement, Father Lange returned to his residence in Shenandoah County.

In 2013, he published a book, *Windows into the Life of a Priest*, which chronicled his journey from a troubled youth to a Catholic priest. The book is dedicated to the Blessed Mother.

Funeral arrangements are still pending.

Dear Fellow teens of Saint Peter's,

As you know some teens from the parish joined up with teens from Saint Joseph's parish out of Petersburg, Virginia to go on a hike of Old Rag Mountain. It can be agreed (and you can see proof of it in the poster hanging up in the vestibule.) that a great time was had by all as we 'stumbled' through the rock scramble, enjoyed the views, and afterwards had dinner back at Saint Peter's and played cards. During the event however, I was thinking how we need to get a youth group going here at Saint Peter's.

Along with fellow teen Teresa Lee, we have organized two activates (including the hike) for teens to get together and hang out. The other event was organized by Teresa where in some of our teens gathered at the Rappahannock Senior Center around Christmas, and had a cookie exchange with the seniors and sang Christmas carols, as well as brought joy to the seniors lives. But besides that we haven't had much in the way of a 'youth group'. So my idea is to get a group going that would probably meet once a month to start off with. We could have our meetings after Saturday evening mass, or Sunday afternoon/evenings; whichever time is preferred.
