I am writing regarding the care and support of our retired diocesan priests. As you may know, there are 175 diocesan priests faithfully serving Jesus Christ and our diocesan Church. Of these, 18 priests are retired currently, and over the next ten years 19 additional priests will reach retirement age.

To provide care for our current and future retired priests, the annual second collection for retired priests will take place next weekend, **June 6 and 7**, at all Masses. I ask you to consider participating as generously as you are able in next week's collection.

The funds from this annual collection will assist the ongoing operational needs and expenses of the *Saint Rose of Lima Priests Retirement Villa*, a residence designed to accommodate retired diocesan priests. 
