

MYTH ABOUT HOMELESSNESS IN AMERICA

Getting a job will keep someone out of homelessness. The National Low Income Housing Coalition found a full-time minimum wage worker would have to work between 69 and 174 hours a week, depending on the state, to pay for an "affordable" two-bedroom rental unit (the federal government defines affordable as 30 percent of a person's income.) In no state could a full-time minimum wage worker afford a one or two-bedroom apartment at Fair Market Rent, a standard set by the federal government.
