

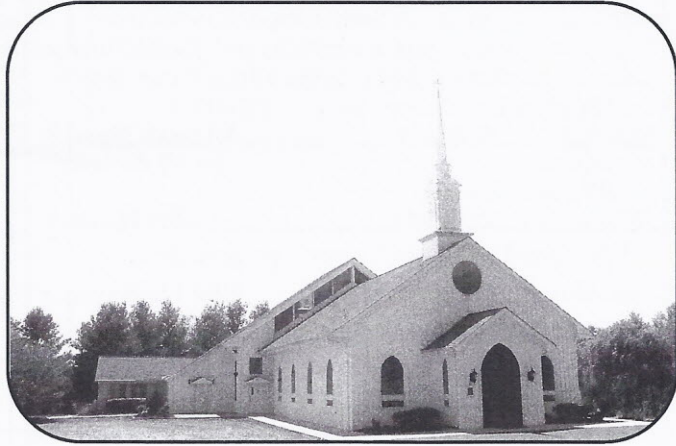

FACT ABOUT THE MINIMUM WAGE AND THE PEOPLE WHO EARN IT



Twenty-nine states, plus the District of Columbia and nearly two dozen cities and counties, have set their own, higher minimums.

State hourly minimums range from \$7.50 in Arkansas, Maine and New Mexico to \$9.47 in Washington state, according to the National Conference of State Legislatures. Together, these states include 61% of the nation's working age (16 and over) population, according to our analysis of U.S. Census Bureau data. Among the cities that have enacted even higher local minimums are San Francisco (\$15 by 2018), Seattle (\$15 by 2021). Chicago (\$13 by 2019) and Washington, D.C. (\$11.50 by 2016), according to the National Employment Law Project.
