





CRS Rice Bowl at Our Parish this Lent

Dear Parishioners,

This Lent, our parish is praying, fasting, learning and giving with CRS Rice Bowl, a program of Lenten spirituality that helps us to experience our Catholic faith and to learn about and help people in need here in the Arlington diocese and around the world. What is Rice Bowl, and how can it help you on your Lenten journey?

What Operation Rice Bowl Is Not: Rice Bowl is not a collection.

What Operation Rice Bowl Is: Rice Bowl is the official Lenten program of Catholic Relief Services, the overseas relief and development agency of the United States Catholic Bishops. It calls Catholics in the U.S. to reach out to people in poverty around the world through the traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, learning, and giving.

How Can You Participate? Don't just write a check! Commit to making Rice Bowl a central part of your Lenten journey. Take home a Rice Bowl and keep it on your dinner table throughout Lent. Use it as a simple reminder that many people around the world survive on less than one bowl of rice a day. Use the Lenten Spiritual Guide that accompanies it to enrich your Lenten experience. Read the Stories of Hope from around the world. Cook and share the meatless meals. Pray, fast, learn and give.



- · Pray the CRS Lenten Prayer for the people who are helped by CRS at home and abroad.
- Fast -- Use recipes in the Rice Bowl Spiritual Guide to prepare simple meals that can help you
 identify with people who are in need. Make other sacrifices for our brothers and sisters who
 struggle to survive.
- Learn -- Use the Spiritual Guide each day to learn and meditate about the joys and challenges
 in the lives of people around the world. Talk about how their lives are similar to yours and how
 they are different.
- Give -- Put the money you saved through your sacrifices in your Rice Bowl.

Who Benefits From Your Participation In Operation Rice Bowl? 25% of contributions to Rice Bowl stays right here in the Arlington diocese to provide small grants to fund efforts to fight hunger locally. 75% of contributions funds CRS's work to bring food security to people around the world. CRS operates seed programs for farmers, teaches the use of better agricultural methods that increase crop yields, and teaches families about nutrition. CRS also helps provide access to clean water, sanitation, and better healthcare for mothers and their children, and makes education available to improve people's ability to earn a living.

2017 CATHOLIC DIOCESE OF ARLINGTON GRANTEES CRS RICE BOWL

The following organizations have received grants from the Arlington Diocese's CRS Rice Bowl grant program to help fund their operations in 2017. The grant funds were raised through the generous participation of parishes, schools, youth groups and religious education programs of the Arlington Diocese, in Catholic Relief Services' Rice Bowl Lenten program during Lent, 2016.

Christ Church Food Pantry (Spotsylvania)

\$2000

Feeds the hungry in the surrounding community, with primary emphasis on Spotsylvania County and the City of Fredericksburg. **Use of Funds:** to meet the Pantry's only direct cost – the cost of food obtained from the Fredericksburg Area Food Bank, of which it is a member.

Feed My Sheep (Gordonsville)

\$3000

An ecumenical food pantry, of which St. Isidore the Farmer Church is a member, serves low-income persons living within a 15-mile radius of Gordonsville. Serves two free lunches per month financed by FMS's members, and supplies food from the pantry and from members' gardens. Also holds community exchange programs and provides education to clients about budgeting and food preparation. **Use of Funds:** to purchase perishables like milk, bread, fruits and vegetables as well as grocery food cards to supplement the pantry's stock of food.

Guadalupe Free Clinic Pharmacy Formulary (Colonial Beach)

\$2000

The onsite pharmacy of Guadalupe Free Clinic (a part of the Diocese of Arlington), provides low-cost prescription medication to the Clinic's indigent and medically uninsured patients. **Use of Funds:** to purchase medications most commonly prescribed by GFC doctors — in particular, those used to treat chronic hypertension, diabetes and heart disease.

Mila-Wicomico Food Pantry (Heathsville)

\$2500

A project of Wicomico United Methodist Church, the Pantry feeds low-income people, particularly the elderly and children, in a community that is about seventy-five percent low-income, disabled and/or elderly. **Use of Funds:** to purchase food.

Food Assistance Project, St. Paul Catholic Mission (Hague)

\$1500

St. Paul's Food Assistance Project supplements other longstanding charitable activities, which include support of Guadalupe Free Clinic, Bay Aging, Hospice Support Services and the Haven Shelter for Battered women. **Use of Funds:** to provide direct food assistance for local individuals and families.

White Stone Baptist Church Food Pantry (White Stone)

\$3000

A once-a-week pantry that has operated since 2009 and provides food to low-income residents of Lancaster County. **Use of Funds:** to purchase a refrigeration unit to store perishables and produce, as part of a pilot food program for senior citizens.

Emergency Food Pantry, Zion United Methodist Church (Spotsylvania) \$2500

Open late afternoon-early evening to accommodate the hours of the working poor in Spotsylvania, although it serves all those in need. Benefits from the work of young volunteers from the Rappahannock Juvenile Detention Center, who carry boxes, stack shelves and help in many other ways. Use of Funds: to purchase food from the Fredericksburg Area Food Bank
