




FEEDING THE HUNGRY On June 1, Knights Bill Jarrett and Tom

A MESSAGE FROM BISHOP BURBIDGE ON IMMIGRATION


What does the Church teach about immigration? The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "The more prosperous nations are obliged, to the extent they are able, to welcome the foreigner in search of the security and the means of livelihood which he cannot find in his country of origin.... Immigrants are obliged to respect with gratitude the material and spiritual heritage of the country that receives them, to obey its laws and to assist in carrying civic burdens" (2241). Not every individual American is prosperous, but our nation is indeed among the most prosperous in the world, and so we are called not to keep our blessings to ourselves, but to share our goods with our brothers and sisters.
