SURVEY FROM THE VATICAN FOR ALL YOUNG PEOPLE.

Pope Francis wants to hear from all youth 16-29 vears old.

As you have heard, His Holiness Pope Francis will convene the XV Ordinary General Assembly of Bishops in October 2018 on the theme Young People, the Faith and Vocational Discernment. In preparation for the Synod, a document was distributed to every Bishop around the world. This document requested that each Bishop respond to a questionnaire. Bishop Burbidge is in the process of consulting with others and is preparing his response to Cardinal DiNardo, President of the USCCB.

A second part of the Synod process will include an opportunity for young people (16-29 years old) of the Diocese of Arlington to speak directly to Bishop Burbidge about their faith lives and the joys and challenges of living their faith and discerning their vocation within the Church. Events to facilitate this interaction will take place closer to the dates of the Synod in 2018.

A third part of the Synod is the opportunity for every young person in the world (Catholic or otherwise) to share their thoughts directly with Pope Francis. Pope Francis wrote a letter to all of the young people of the world which encourages them to let their voice be heard. To assist with this, the Vatican has set up an online survey which can be found at https://surveysynod2018.glauco.it/limesurvey/

index.php/147718 (you may need to select the English version on the upper right of the page.) I encourage the youth to share the link with their friends.


MASS AND HEALING SERVICE — NEXT SATURDAY, JULY 8, 5 PM



RappU to Pay for Healthcare Training Enrollment Fees

Learning organization secures \$25k in donor support to lower barrier to entry for critical local job training opportunities

Sperryville, VA: Today, RappU, which offers programs dedicated to turning local Rappahannock County residents into successful, certificate-bearing healthcare workers, announced they will cover all course expenses for their two primary program offerings, Nurse Aide (CNA) and Home Health Aide (HHA). The courses are now completely free of charge - county residents' only cost is a \$25 application fee.

"When we launched these programs earlier this year, we knew the enrollment process would be a challenging one," said Doug Schiffman, founder of RappU. "It can cost from \$100 - \$200 or more to complete all the necessary requirements to even be considered for admission. Add \$600 for course tuition, textbooks and testing fees, and we realized it was a pretty high barrier to entry for many of our local residents."

After receiving an offer from Rappahannock philanthropists Bill and Linda Dietel of \$5,000 to seed the program, RappU took action. They are confident they will be able to provide at least 25 students with a free healthcare training opportunity with the \$25,000 expected to be raised. Those funds will be used to cover the following program expenses:

- Application-related expenses: a literacy test, Virginia and nationwide criminal background check, drug screen, a physical and required immunizations
- · Course fees tuition, hospital scrubs, textbook and workbook
- Testing fees Virginia CNA certification exam

In addition, RappU has created a referral program to help continue to build awareness for the program - they'll pay \$50 to any applicant who refers another successful applicant to RappU (someone who completes the full screening process and enrolls).

Courses will be held in Summer and Fall of 2017 at the RappU facility on Lee Highway in Sperryville, VA. Daytime, evening and weekend hours are offered depending on student preferences. Full program information can all be viewed at www.rappu.org.
