

Harold Beebout of the Sperryville Rescue Squad will talk about strokes and "What happens when you call 911". Beebout wants people to know how important it is to call 911 when someone may be having a stroke. He's seen situations where the failure to recognize signs of a stroke and to call 911 have resulted in potentially preventable death and disability. He will discuss stroke symptoms and how to recognize a possible stroke in others. He will also discuss what happens when you calls 911; what procedures are performed in a rescue vehicle; and which hospital an individual can be transported to.
